Humans always think of themselves first. Sometimes that leads them to destroy nature, and sometimes it also leads to humans attacking one another. Popoki has a lot of friends, including human ones. I think that because he has so many different friends, the peace that Popoki thinks about must be complicated. What does peace look like to Popoki? I cannot imagine the way he must perceive it.
