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Report: Reading of *Popoki, What Color is Peace?* at the Habikino City Special Peace Exhibit

On 7 August, we held a reading of *Popoki, What Color is Peace?* and made plastic key holders at the JICA Osaka booth at the Habikino City Special Peace Exhibit.

Children are on vacation from school for the summer and they come to this special peace exhibit with their families and friends. When 3-5 people gathered at our booth, we began reading *Popoki, What Color is Peace?* and talked about peace together. When we finished, each person drew their own image of peace on plastic which we then heated in an oven toaster and made into key holders.

After listening to Popoki's questions, the children, even those who at first looked askance after just hearing the word 'peace,' seemed able to create a concrete image of peace. They drew a variety of images, including their own or others' favorite flowers and trees. They were all pleased with their key holders, which they took home with them. I think that these key holders will be a very small reminder to the children to think about peace in their everyday lives.

Through this event, I was surprised at the power of Popoki's questions and the rich sensitivity of the childrens' responses. It reminded me of the importance of thinking about peace in one's own context and made me want to promote such opportunities.
